When you wear a face mask it can help to keep

you and other people safe from the coronavirus.





Coronavirus

• can make people very sick

and

• is spread when you are close to someone else.



Does my support worker need to wear a face mask and eye protection?

Your support worker **must** always wear

• a face mask

and

• eye protection.



#### This means


• when they are in your home

and



• when they give you support.

Your support worker **must** wear a face mask and eye protection to help keep you safe.



Support workers **must** wear a paper mask that is only used once.



Support workers **must** always bring their own face mask and eye protection.



Support workers must **not** give you support if they do **not** feel well.



This is to make sure they do **not** spread the coronavirus if they have it.

What if I do not want my support worker to wear a face mask and eye protection?



Talk to your support worker if they wear a face mask and eye protection and you

• feel worried



• need to see their face to feel supported



• cannot hear or understand them.



You can talk to your support worker about another way to protect you from the spread of the coronavirus.

#### Do I need to wear a face mask when I am with my support worker?



You can wear a face mask when your support worker helps you

• in your home

or



• outside your home.



You do **not** have to wear a face mask in your home if you do **not** feel comfortable.



You can talk to your support worker about another way to protect you from the spread of the coronavirus.

### How often should my support worker change their face mask?

Your support worker should change their



• if it gets wet or dirty

face mask

• after 4 hours

• if it breaks or gets a hole in it



• when they start to help a different person.




Do all people who visit my home need to wear a face mask?

If someone comes to your home they **must** wear a face mask.

For example, a delivery driver.

You must check the rules to find out if

• people can visit you in your home



or

• you can visit others in their home.

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If you live in aged care or a disability residential service there are rules about

• how many people can visit you

and



• how long someone can visit you for.



Your visitor **must** wear a face mask.




Do parents need to wear face masks when they are their child's carer?

Parents do **not** need to wear a face mask when they care for their child in their own home.



Children will feel safe and happy if they can see their parent's face.

You should wear a face mask if you or your child has the coronavirus.

You **must** wear a face mask when you go outside your home.
